Multiple choice (single answer)

Instruction:Pick the SINGLE correct answer.Grading:A correct answer is worth 1 point; an incorrect answer is worth -1/4 point.

Multiple choice (multiple answer)

- Instruction: Pick ALL the correct responses; for each question there will always be at least one correct response.
- Grading: A correct response is worth 1 point; an incorrect response is worth -1 point. The minimum score is zero i.e. you will NOT receive less than zero points on any question regardless of how you answer.

True / False

Instruction:Indicate whether the statement is TRUE or FALSE.Grading:A correct response is worth 1 point; an incorrect response is worth -1 point.

Short Answer

Instruction:	Answer each question to the best of your abilities. Each response should require a maximum of 2 – 4 sentences or less.
Grading:	Every question is worth 5 points except where otherwise noted. A complete and correct response is worth the full point value; an incorrect or empty response is worth zero; partially correct responses may be awarded partial points; you will NOT receive a negative score on any question.

Fill-in

Instruction:Fill-in the blank with the correct response.Grading:Each correct response is worth 5 points; a partially correct response may be awarded
partial points.
You will NOT receive negative points for an incorrect response.

Essay

Instruction:	Pick ONE essay question to answer; your response should be at most 2 to 3 pages in length.
Grading:	Your response will be graded based on its correctness, completeness, attention to detail etc. The essay is worth 50 points.

BONUS

Instruction: Answer the question to the best of your abilities. This is an opportunity for you to demonstrate what you have by learned by constructing and supporting a logical argument. **There is no right or wrong answer.** You will be awarded bonus points based on how sound and **relevant** your arguments are, how well you support your statements, and the originality of your ideas.

Grading: You can receive up to 10 bonus points. This question is NOT mandatory and you will NOT lose any marks if you don't answer or answer poorly.
